New quarry proposed for Temple Guiting



An application has been made to construct a new quarry at Norman's Field, Fiddlers Green, Temple Guiting. This stage is the Scoping Report and the parish council has responded with a list of recommendations. All planning documents can be seen on the Gloucestershire County Council Planning portal, under reference <u>17/00087/SCOPE</u>. Our Cotswold District Councillor, Nigel Moor, has also been contacted. The next stage will be after Gloucestershire County Council has responded.

Road damage and speeding



A recent meeting with Highways lodged complaints about the damage and danger of the increasing use of parish roads by large vehicles and speeding drivers. Highways is considering measures to combat the problems and TGPC is actively involved. Possible measures include weight restrictions, although even when approved these would take at least 1 year to put in place, and identifying speeding patterns and locations more accurately.

If you go down to the woods today	
	Game season is getting underway with a large number of birds in the private woods around Temple Guiting, Kineton and Guiting Power. It is dangerous to enter the woods as guns or dogs could be in action. At other times, it is unwise to enter the woods due to the possibility of disturbing the wildlife, as the woods are also important in conserving native species. In addition, muntjac are legal targets all year round.
Bin binned	
	We have had to remove the bin at the village hall because it has become a health hazard. While most people who use the hall take their rubbish away with them, others have dumped large amounts of rubbish in or next to the bin including packaging and left overs from entire picnics, bags of rubbish and even a bag of used nappies. The rubbish poses a special hazard to children using the hall for their lunches as well as when using the field for games.
